The Michigan Townships Association has provided a Resolution in Opposition to Local Preemption on Utility-Scale Renewable Energy Facilities if local jurisdictions are interested in adopting it.

Business from Audience: A Royalton Township resident would like the board to reconsider allowing the sale of recreation marihuana in the Township. A second Royalton Township resident said that they liked the way things were and did not think Royalton needed to allow the sale of recreational marihuana when it can be purchased 3 miles down the road.

Items not on Agenda:

A Royalton Township resident expressed that she is unhappy with the state of her neighbor's property. It is a mess with lots of trash and vehicles in the yard. The neighbor was served by the Township with a notice in April and has slowly been cleaning up his property. However, he has a camper and trash that is on her property, and she cannot have her fence installed until it is moved off her property. Tilly stated that he will speak with the Zoning and Ordinance Administrator and have him issue another notice to get the items moved off her property faster.

Julie Wuerful gave updates from the County. The County Board of Commissioners tabled their solar resolution and asked if Tilly could send her the resolution just approved at this meeting to review. She asked for feedback on the road projects and the process of the group meeting. Basselman stated that he liked when individual jurisdictions meet with the road department individually instead of as a group as it created better relationships.

Committee Reports:

Basselman (Fire Board) stated that the Fire Department is still working on a proposal for a fire truck, and at this time it is taking 54 months for new trucks to be built.

Tilly (Water & Sewer) stated that the City of St. Joseph will be getting the bill from the water main break that drained Royalton's water tower.

Tilly (Medic I) stated that Medic I is now contracted with Hagar Township, Pipestone and Watervliet and Coloma City and Townships. They are going to put an ambulance in the new Hagar fire station to help service the north County area better.

Riegel (Building report) was submitted prior to meeting.
